Recently a resident received a telephone call from someone stating that they were from the NYS Controller's office, and that the resident had unclaimed money. The resident was asked to pay \$35.00; then the State Controller's office would send them their funds. The resident believing this was a legitimate call, gave the caller their credit card number. The call was a scam and has been reported to the NYS Fraud Unit. If you receive a call or suspect fraud, the NYS Controller's office asks that you call the NYS Fraud Department at 1-800-771-7755. If you would like to check and see if you have unclaimed funds, you can visit their web site at www.osc.state.ny.us and go to unclaimed funds. You can also call their call center at 1-518-270-2205 8:00 am-5:00 pm. Some residents have called this number and have visited the NYS's site and discovered that they were owed money. Please never give out credit card or bank acct. information over an incoming call.

It is very important that you do not allow visitors in the front door. We recently had visitors who were let in the building freely without buzzing the apartment. There are residents here that have moved here because of the security we have in place. We had a visitor who had visited here before and was let in unknown to the resident. The resident did not want the visitor and the visitor showed up unexpectedly at their door. I must insist that everyone follow the rules when it comes to this. You cannot allow anyone in and they must be buzzed in by the person they are visiting. I also ask that if you are entering the building, and you see a visitor walking in behind you, please stop and tell the visitor that they need to go to the call box and call the apartment number to be allowed in the building. All vendors have been either given a key fob or a code to get in. Just because you see someone here frequently does not mean that they belong here. Anyone violating this rule will be given a verbal warning and if they do it again, they will be given a written warning. Your safety is important to us. Unwanted guests can cause safety issues, so we ask that you abide by these rules.

I have asked this before, but I feel that it is important to mention. If you would like to use the Community Room, please sign it out and ask beforehand. I say this because we have recently had a couple of conflicts with people using the room, when the room was supposed to be empty. If you would like to use the room, please check the calendar to see if there is anything scheduled. If you do not see anything, the next step

would be to contact myself and see if anyone has it signed out. I know it doesn't seem like a big deal if you get together to talk, have a meeting, play a game, etc. in the community room. Normally when it is not scheduled for an event, it is not an issue. However, conflicts arise when one party has a planned event and another party looks in the community room, believing that it's a go ahead because no one is in there, not realizing that in 20 minutes there is someone who has either reserved the room, or had planned on setting it up for an event. Thank you so much for your cooperation.

A resident has suggested that we plan a "Life's Journey" event. What is that? Residents would meet in the Community Room and talk about events that have happened in their life. It could be the way they were raised, places they have visited, things about their experiences as they were growing up, etc. The possibilities are endless. This is a wonderful way to share things about ourselves that others might not know. Do we have a published author here? Maybe someone who has been in a movie or has famous relatives. Maybe one of your neighbors has visited a place that you have considered going. The first "Kitchen Talk will be April 14th, at 1:00 p.m. in the Community Room.

We will be having a Comedy Night on April 19th, from 6:30-7:30. The cost will be \$5.00 per person. We are having **Jesse Derringer**. **THE VOICE! THE MUSIC! THE SHOW!** Jesse Derringer performs a show like no other. He combines great singing, music, comedy and impressions into one entertainment spectacular. Whether you dance to some great tunes, or just sit back and enjoy the show, you're sure to be entertained. Don't miss it!

CAR INFORMATION, PARKING, AND PARKING LOTS - If you should purchase a new vehicle, please update the car information with me in the office. I will need the type of car, make, color and any change in your license plate #. Lately, we have had several concerns about parking and the parking lots. This is what your lease states and what we will be enforcing.

PARKING / PARKING LOTS: Parking spaces are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Only a limited number of marked handicapped spaces are available. These are public spaces. Calamar and management of the community cannot assign the marked handicapped parking spaces. Handicapped parking is available to any persons with a placard issued from the Motor Vehicle Department. Friends and relatives must park in the visitor parking area only, it is your responsibility to let your guests know that. Vehicles must be in acceptable condition as defined below to park within the community:

Valid Registration and Plates Operable/Running Tires intact/inflated

Windows in place

Utilized on a regular basis (Cannot be parked for one month without use, except in garages)

Not used for storage purposes

Not leaking fluids or oil

Any vehicle not meeting the above criteria will be considered abandoned and may be subject to towing. Vehicles parked improperly in loading or emergency zones and vehicles not abiding by the parking policy will be towed at vehicle owner's expense without notice. Commercial vehicles, recreational vehicles, boats, and trailers are prohibited.

When you receive your **LEASE RENEWAL OFFER LETTER**, it is just the offer not the actual lease. You must sign the LEASE which is a separate piece of paper. Furthermore, I cannot accept your signed lease unless I have your proof of renter's insurance which must be your insurance certificate saying that you have renter's insurance coverage. Insurance bills, insurance receipts, etc. are not acceptable as proof of insurance.

PET OWNERS, With the deer population that we have around our community, we need to be mindful of ticks that get on our pets. I want to remind you that it is in your lease to have a flea and tick program in effect for your pet. The lease states that:

Every dog and cat must be registered with the manager prior to admission and annually during the resident's lease renewal. Registration of dogs and cats require:

- Proof of licensure (if required in city/county)
- Proof of up-to-date inoculations
- Verification that the pet has been spayed or neutered (or documentation from a veterinarian that such surgery would be detrimental to the animal's health)
- Evidence of a flea & tick control program
- Verification of a pet guardian in case of pet owner unavailability.

I know much of the information I have shared with you is repetitive, however, we have newer residents that haven't read previous newsletters with this information and some residents need to be updated. Even though you may have read it before, please read the information in the newsletter so that you may have a clear understanding of what is expected of you and your neighbors. Thanks for your understanding of this.
