SOME REMINDERS FROM SUE

- 1) When the Community Room is in use for a private party, please do not interrupt or go into the Community Room. Residents are not prohibited from using the grills or patio if there is a party going on in the Community Room. If a resident uses the Community Room and kitchen, they will need to clean it afterwards. The tables will need to be wiped down, kitchen cleaned and swept, and all trash needs to be taken to the dumpster. This also applies to any groups that use these rooms i.e. activities, Bible Study, Bingo, games, etc.
- 2) Please DO NOT LET ANYONE in the front door who is not visiting you, the resident may not be expecting the guest and may appreciate the "heads up" of the security system. It may be that the resident does not want that person visiting; please leave it to the resident to make that decision. Safety and security is on everyone's mind and when residents allow people into the building, it may create a safety concern. I hope all residents will explain to their family members/guests the procedure to use the call box to allow them into the building. The only exception to this should be for the U.S. Mail, UPS, FEDEX, etc.
- 3) Only Auburn Grove events are to be posted on the bulletin boards by the elevators and outside the community room. If you have something for sale, community event, church event please put it on the community room board in the community room. **However**, please check with the manager **first** before posting anything.
- 4) All submissions to the newsletter must go through management before it goes into the newsletter. Please see Sue Allen if you would like something in the newsletter; the closing for the newsletter each month is the 22nd.
- 5) New signs have gone up informing visitors of the designated resident parking spots. We would appreciate it if all residents would remember to tell their visitors that they must park in the visitor parking areas unless they are handicapped and then they may park in the handicapped parking areas with their handicapped placard.
- 6) Now that the warmer weather is here, if you are going up to Kostas and using the gate, please remember to lock it behind you.
- 7) It is wonderful to have all residents participate in coffee hour. It's a great way to hear about upcoming events, and socialize with your neighbors. It is your opportunity to ask questions and find out what is happening around the community. We ask that if you have a specific concern with your apartment, out of respect for other residents and for confidentiality, please do not bring that up at Coffee hour. Coffee hour is not the place for specific concerns regarding your apartment. If you have a concern, and it is maintenance related, please submit a work order. If it is not a specific maintenance issue, and it is causing you concern, please bring it to my attention. Your safety and satisfaction is important to all of us. Thank you.
- 8) We have received some complaints from residents as well as family members of

residents about the gossiping in the library. Please be mindful of what you are discussing in the community areas.
